DILG awards Capiz P7M for Seal of Good Housekeeping

The Department of Interior and Local Government Region 6 (DILG6) headed by Dir. Evelyn Trompeta recently awarded the Province of Capiz its P7-million cash reward for winning the Seal of Good Housekeeping in 2012.

Capiz Gov. Victor Tanco and Vice-Gov. Evan Contreras led the province in receiving the check from DILG during a short program March 7, witnessed by department heads and employees of the Capiz Provincial Capitol 7 at the Office of the Governor in Roxas City.

Tanco said that the received incentive of the Province will be used for the improvement of the services delivered for the constituents.

He added that some of the amount will be used for the road rehabilitation of the provincial roads in Maayon and Dumalag, among others.

Tanco also added that he is confident that the 2013's Seal of Good Housekeeping will be awarded again to the province because of their

effort to make the governance in the province transparent and reliable.

Tanco expressed certainty that Capiz can attain next year's award because the province has been on the top three spot in the DILG Region VI Excel Awards.

According to Trompeta, the province has gained the Seal because it "complied with the requirement of transparency and accountability by posting the liquidation of trust funds in conspicuous places."

Aside from the Capiz provincial government, good governance has also been seen in Roxas City.

She added that while some municipalities failed in other provinces, all of the 16 municipalities in Capiz excelled.

Army stops racking NPA; operation ends in gunfight

San Joaquin, Iloilo—82nd Infantry Battalion of Philippine Army encountered a group of New People's Army (NPA) in Barangay Bad-as, this town.

The responding troop, while conducting peace and security patrol, received a report from the civilians of the said barangay that an NPA group was extorting money and food supplies from the residents.

Army recovered backpacks, personal belongings, and subversive

documents of high intelligence value after the NPA withdrew to different directions.

The gunfight lasted 25 minutes, army said.

Investigation concludes undetermined number of casualties from the NPA due to bloodstains in the encounter site, while none in the military.

"We always respond on the call of the people and we will never falter in our efforts to maintain peace and security in their

communities," said Lt. Col. Aldwine Almase, of 82nd IB Commander.

Maj. Gen. Jose Mabanta Jr, 3rd ID Commander said, "The Army's commitment to peace and security will always be felt by our people who wanted no other than a peaceful living and who are helping each other in order to have a progressive community."

Pursuit operation is presently undertaken by the government troops to run after the fleeing rebels.

Poetry As the Canary At the End of A Mine Shaft

Eric Gamalinda's Amigo Warfare is an act of faith on the survival of the poet's voice amidst the mad march of humanity towards annihilation. Culled from guerilla-tactics employed by Filipinos who appear as friendly farmers at daylight but carry their guns at night in their resistance against American occupation of their country, the title of this poetry collection also carries this duality in the 39 poems which teeter on the poles of war and healing, memory and forgiveness, apocalyptic metaphysics and Christian hope.

A recipient of an American Literary Award for previous his poetry book Zero Gravity and the New York Foundation for the Arts grant for fiction, Gamalinda continues the re-examination of a post-911 world. Only here he poses the question, if not the blame, on America itself. "Because you send a shining fleet/ of your youngest men/ lust still forming in their bones," the persona in the title poem tells a personified America.

This doesn't make the poems, however, less American-friendly. It is more echoing the call not to let go of the light amidst the dark reality that "war is inescapable. You must bomb/ a few towns if you want peace. If we have children/ they will be among the nine out of ten/ who will never speak in the future tense" ("Two Nudes"); and where, "The world's great wars/ are fought on prime time TV" ("Ego>Lust>Guilt"); and therefore, "the nights we dreaded/ surfing the channels for comfort are here/ at last, all that cinema dreamed for us/ has come to pass" ("9/12").

It is clearly a vision of the apocalypse, now, where the end of the world is seen as coming "slowly, like madness, like a boat/ cruising the Seine" ("Melting City"). Amidst and despite this pessimism, however, is a voice that refuses the dying of the human light and existence, clutching on the last straws of hope, "but there must be a season/ no one has weapons or currency for/ in which smallest voices/ still give praise to rain" ("The Remembered World"); and, "Through all the wars of our two centuries/ there must have been at least one soul/ that remained unbroken" ("Tekitte").

It is the poet's voice: "And I became a poet/ so I would have nothing to do/ with the government of humans/ only to carry like river water/ in pails on two ends of a stick/ the weight of remembering/ and the weight of forgiving" ("My Generation"); for "Grief is a nation of everyone/ a country without borders," and; "We are so many bodies, my friends/ We all move in the same direction" ("DMZ").

Amigo Warfare then plays the role that American poet Galway Kinnell sees of poetry in our age, that is, as a canary at the end of a mine shaft. It makes us see our salvation and common route. Such affirmation makes Amigo Warfare really a friendly reminder in an age of warfare.

Note: The poetry and fiction of Frank Peñones, Jr., Bikol poet, were published in Field of Mirrors: An Anthology of Philippine American Writers; and Reed Magazine of the San Jose State University in California where he obtained a graduate degree in creative writing on a study grant from the International Ford Foundation.

Conclusion

In a brief interview on January 17, Atty. Remia Bartolome clarified that "isa man lang ang ant intensyong tanan," i.e. to bring out the truth of alleged gross medical negligence thrown at the RMPH.

Whether an executive fact-finding committee is organized pursuant to my Resolution or one yet to be established by the Sangguniang Panlalawigan in the exercise of its inherent power in aid of legislation, the investigation must be confined to the incident last Dec. 31.

Its intent is neither punitive nor corrective insofar as the issuance of the Resolution is concerned, whatever & whichever committee acquires jurisdiction.

The main concerns, to me are: 1) to ensure that the same investigation is done within the framework of the committee's mandate, powers or functions, in the hope of, 2) finding solutions to improve hospital service for, as well as in, 3) achieving its availability, accessibility and affordability to, the marginalized sectors.

When pressed on the accountability of those erring parties, Atty. Remia clarified that the "option is open to or a prerogative of the parents of Jen Fred".

In one of her unofficial, informal and initial talks with hospital stakeholders, Bartolome disclosed this idea of establishing a pool of surgeons to address the shortage of surgeons in the Operating Rooms (ORs) of various government hospitals.

She admitted that this idea came from a competent, reliable source. She added that "those surgeons included in the Pool may be assigned on specific days on a rotation-basis, to avoid the influx of patients coming from various municipalities. With the surgeons from the Pool deployed outside of the RMPH, the surgical service can be done right there at the municipal public hospitals.

"With respect to patients coming from private hospitals, greater coordination is needed, regular dialogues must be done, and an inter-hospital referral scheme had to be designed and carried out in cooperative undertaking."

This proposed pool of surgeons, however, requires increased budgetary allocation, better facilities and more commitment on the part of medical practitioners. The first step is to increase the RMPH budget or the budget for our various government-managed hospitals.

Referring to the fact-finding committee, Atty. Bartolome is optimistic that the inclusion of the press representation won't

Who is Frank Peñones, Jr.? Considered to be one of the instigators of the resurgence of the Bikol literature (according to National Artist for Literature Virgilio Almario), Iriga poet Frank Peñones, Jr., or FPJ, looms large in the current affairs of Bikol letters owing to the fact that he stood out as one of the users of the Bikol language in the time of nationalistic ferment for regional literatures.

What is the influence of FPJ's poetry to the Bikol consciousness? In an interview, Frank Peñones, Jr. himself said that "I think it is my persistence early on to write "sa salagan kan satong dila (nest of our own language)." [which is] my effort in raising a Bikol agimadmad or consciousness.

Why is he considered by Bikol scholar Ma. Lilia Realubit to have sounded the "clarion call for the resurgence" of the Bikol literature?

Peñones is said to have "sounded the clarion call for the resurgence of the Bikol literature in the 1990s." The label was accorded to him by Bikol scholar Ma. Lilia Realubit, who earlier produced Bikols of the Philippines, a pioneering work whom Bikolista Jesuit James O'Brien called the "book of the century"

Attraction gravity is real, spacetime is not

Part 1

This is incredible: Modern science is dangerously misled. in the year of its publication in 1983, or some three decades ago.

In 1991, Realubit observed the dearth in literary production in the Bikol language; and until the 1970s, only young poets using Bikol as medium were writing on contemporary themes. According to Realubit, "it is the young writers who are beginning to be aware of the contemporary regional problems and national issues, and the young people who are using Bikol and Filipino in their writing. Among others, Frank Peñones, Jr.'s 'Opon sa Ibalon: Pagkahale kan Maskara' has been able to see the unity of the past and present."

While FPJ thinks this is rather Realubit's personal opinion, Paz Verdades Santos, a prolific Bikol scholar, found Peñones to be "the most persistent and productive in the writing and publishing of literature in at least two Bikol languages," even when literature in regional languages was not the fad as it is now. For Santos, it was Peñones "who cleared a space for Bikol in the rugged terrain of vernacular literature."

What has he done to help clear the space for Bikol writing?

In 1992, a year after he was awarded a writing grant by the Cultural Center of the Philippines (CCP) for Bikol poetry, Peñones helped launch the Bikol literary group Kabulig, along with Rudy Alano, his teacher at the Ateneo, which sought to clear space for dialogue and projects for Bikol literature. His past and current active participation in the Bikol literati have so far left an indelible mark in the growing following.

Among others, FPJ is also noted for being a prolific journalist, gaining recognition for active engagement and publication in the local print media. His "Halo-Halo" columns discussing culture, literature and politics and published since 2000s on the weekly Bikol Reporter and other local weeklies based in Naga City ushered in the appreciation of the Bikol language. For three consecutive years from 2001 to 2003, Frank Peñones, Jr. was cited Outstanding English and Bikol Columnist given by the St. Peter Baptist Catholic Mass Media Awards of the Archdiocese of Caceres.

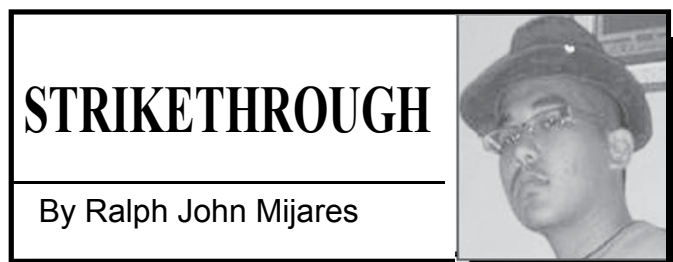
He said that the old process took 4 to 5 days before the bill could be delivered to the concessionaires.

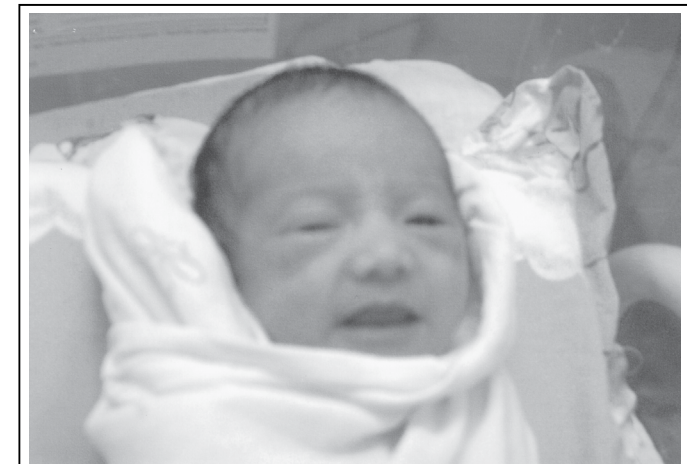

CAPIZ TRIVIA

As to the origin of the name of Maayon not much has been written about it, but folks speak of several versions and one among those considered most popular was when a group of Spanish soldiers while pursuing the insurrectos, discovered a settlement near the bank of the river. Finding the people to be hospitable and nice, they asked for the name of the place. Since the natives did not understand the Spanish language, they assumed that what the Spaniards were asking for what is the status of the harvest for them it was harvest time. The natives answered "Mango man". So the Spaniards named the settlement "El Pueblo de Maayo". Thus, the name Maayon was derived from that word and to this very day, it is known as such. Maayon first became a town during the early American era. However, during the Cadastral Survey, it was reverted to a barrio status under the Municipality of Pontevedra. For nearly half a century, the residents fought hard and long for its restoration to a separate and distinct entity. Their untiring efforts were empty rewarded when in 1995, Carmen Dinglasan Consing, representative of the first District of the Province of Capiz field House Bill No. 2098 in the lower chamber of Congress. Senator Justinano S. Montaña sponsored and steered the bill until its approval. Finally on March 30, 1955 President Ramon Magsaysay signed the bill re-creating the lot Municipality of Maayon, Capiz in a ceremony held in Malacañan.

The "New Municipality" included eight barrios then, namely, Maayon, Fernandez, Pi4a, Balighot, Batabat, Guia, Tuburan and Canapian Sur. Now it has thirty two (32) barangays.

The ceremony was attended by a large delegation from

Capiz. The President also signed the appointment of the following officials of the new town: Rael Declaro; Ernesto Diaz. Vice Mayor; Marcelo Diaz, Felomino Comoro, Damaso Deocampo, Ambrosio Dumagpi, Agustin Barruela, and Marcelo Delfin, Councilors. These official, have gone back to their Maker.

Also present during the historic signing of Republic Act No. 1203 were Representative Godofredo Ramos, Judge and Mr. Rafael Dinglasan, Sr., Judge Antonio J. Beldia, Romeo

Arceño, Gabriel Borres and his two sons Roberto and Athos, Mamerto Dadula. Most of the wives of the officials of the town also witnessed the memorable occasion.

Among the town's first officials were: Uldarico Dieta, Secretary; Amado S. Almalbis, Treasurer; Ponciano Declaro, Judge; Diosdado Borres, Chief of Police; and Dr. Alejandro Orosco, Rural Health Physician. Also Dr. Manuel Buenvenida who was then Rural Health Physician for Pontevedra took charge of the health problems of the new town until his transfer to Pres. Roxas Dr. Ricardo A. Dasal replaced him. It was not until a year later, in 1956, when a regular and the first Rural health Physician was appointed. Rev. Fr. Crisogono Dequina was then parish priest.

Rafael M. Declaro who was also the first elected official of the town during its first election in November 1955 won with less than 200 majority over Atty. D. Artagnan D. Roxas. He relinquished the Mayorship to his running mate-Prudencio L. Alovera - when he assumed the position of municipal judge of the same town. The late Mayor Alovera served from April 17, 1957 to 1971 - the longest term in the 25-year existence of the municipality. Alovera did not seek re-election in 1971, In 1972, Bertile D. Comoro, fresh from college, ran won against the late Jose Diaz III. Comoro serves as the third executive of the town. Until Feb. 1986. When Pres. Corazon C. Aquino won through People's Power, she appointed Jose Diaz, Jr. as an offer in charge of the office of the Mayor from Feb.. 1986-March, 1986. His appointment as a Board Member has been approved after one Month of Service. Rolando L. Eleazar then take charge the office.
